ON ONE FOOT

As I sit down to compose my next to last bulletin article as senior rabbi, it occurs to me that Hebrew has an unusual way of saying "all good things must come to an end." The expression is familiar to us, but in another context. It's motzei Shabbat.



In Israel, where there is no word for "Saturday" other than Shabbat, Saturday night is **motzei Shabbat**, literally, when Shabbat leaves, referencing the time when the stars come out for **Havdalah**. In a purely secular context, the term is referenced by soldiers, who often get leave for Shabbat and then head back to their bases on Sunday morning.

An essay in Tablet, show how this phrase may show up in a sports story that discusses how a soccer team didn't fulfill the promise it had displayed in the first half of the game; or in the headline of an entertainment column that complains that a critically acclaimed TV drama series was coming to an end after five seasons.

Yes, all good things, like Shabbat, must have their denouement, their sunset, their **motzei Shabbat**.

For those of us who set our internal clocks to Jewish time, where each week consists of a series of days building up to Shabbat, that idea resonates. But with the cycles of time, even as all good things must come to an end, there is still next Shabbat to look forward to.

And for us, there are many things to look forward to as well. For the congregation, a new chapter begins, and I extend a Mazal Tov to Rabbi Knopf, who will have my complete support.

And for us, I echo a song that was a big hit back when I was a student in Israel, when on *motzei Shabbat*, everyone would pile into the number 9 bus and get off on Ben Yehuda Street, where the city would pulsate with the possibilities of a new week. It's a Hebrew version of "Everybody Loves Saturday Night," *Kol Ehad Ohev Motzei Shabbat*. It didn't matter when Shabbat ended, summer or winter, a half hour after those stars appeared, the streets would be filled with people. It felt back then that while Shabbat was over in the blink of an eye, there were no limits to how long *motzei Shabbat* would last. And while the best thing had come to an end, a slice of pizza or a banana crepe on Ben Yehuda Street, with the street performers and falafel hawkers, was not so bad.

For me, **motzei Shabbat** - which sounds a lot better than "retirement" – aptly describes where we are headed. It's less Shabbat's denouement than its afterparty.

For us, *motzei Shabbat* means that we'll still be able to maintain contact, just in different ways. You can always reach me via email – and I always like to hear how things are going. And you can keep up on my writing in any number of ways, including this bulletin, where I'll continue to share my ideas, following in the footsteps of my clergy emeritus predecessors. I'll also be syndicating a regular column through the Religion News Service (R.N.S.) and blogging at

Writing a Jewish Song that Matters

In the summer of 2019, a lifetime ago before COVID, I attended my first songwriting retreat entitled, "Writing a Song that Matters" hosted by singer/songwriter Dar Williams and Friends. I went to the Garrison Institute in upstate, NY, knowing nobody and having only



written a handful of songs on my own. Eagerly, I packed all my instruments and headed to this beautiful former monastery, knowing that this week of creativity, inspiration, and music was going to have a major impact on my life. At the time, I was still teaching full time for St. Luke's School, but all the snippets of my songs included lines like, "go where you want to grow," and "take a chance, break free." I knew that I had outgrown my surroundings and my life was about to change, but I couldn't quite figure out how to make it happen. The artistic process through songwriting helped me work several things out at the same time all while becoming part of an incredible community of creative souls.

During my 1:1 session with Dar working on one of my songs, she asked if I knew fellow Jewish singer-songwriter Sue Horowitz. I had met Sue through the Women Cantors' Network but didn't realize that Sue had recently started her own group for Jewish songwriters, The Jewish Collaborative Songwriting Retreat. Dar suggested I connect with Sue and her group (most of the songs I was writing were clearly Jewish songs) and I filed that bit of information away not realizing at the time how valuable it would become. During COVID, when everything took place online, I took a leap and attended one of Sue's winter retreats with JCSR and immediately felt a deep connection and sense of community with my fellow Jewish singer/songwriters.

The JCSR group of artists is an incredibly special, truly collaborative group. I stress the word collaborative because it is such a contrast to the word competitive. In this group, I immediately felt a sense of belonging and began to participate in co-writing with several different musicians. Each writing partner offered another opportunity to expand possibilities, think creatively, solve problems, and work together. In collaboration, I've written several wonderful pieces, some of which I've included in services already, and others which are still considered "wet paint" and not totally finalized.

The friendships and collaborations are special, and they also inspire me to write more confidently in my own voice as a songwriter. At TBE, you may recognize some of my original music and settings of liturgy: "Hava Nashira, L'cha Dodi, V'imru Amen, Healing Niggun, In Darkness, Esa Einai, Send Healing Now, and Song of the Doe." In collaboration, I've been exploring, co-creating, and dreaming up innovative approaches with partners who inspire and nurture the creative process. With our recent musical guest, Caitlin McLaughlin (Fellow JCSR member), I've





CRITICAL VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR BUILDING ONE COMMUNITY (B1C) IN STAMFORD

B1C has a terrific tutoring program for elementary students but doesn't have enough tutors. 14 volunteers (adults or teenagers) are needed on Monday - Thursday from 4:30pm-5:45pm. The kids speak English so you do not need to speak another language but Spanish or French would be useful. Each volunteer works with up to three children.

Volunteers must commit to a minimum of three consecutive months for one session a week, have basic technology skills and familiar with how math is currently taught at the elementary level. 


