



Dear friends,

Each year, as Cantor Kaplan and I — together with our extraordinary team here at TBE — prepare for the High Holy Days, we begin by asking: What do our people need from this sacred season?

This year, that question feels especially urgent.

Many of us are entering the High Holy Day season feeling disoriented, exhausted, and uncertain about our place in the world. We are living in a culture marked by anger and anxiety, distraction and despair, intolerance and isolation. Amid all that noise and pressure, it can be difficult to remain connected to what is deepest within us, what is woven between us, and what is greatest beyond us. It can be difficult simply to remember that we matter.

These conditions do more than wear us down. Anxiety can narrow our field of vision. Anger can make reaction easier than reflection. Distraction can make it difficult to attend deeply to anything or anyone. Intolerance can reduce other people to labels or caricatures, while isolation can convince us that we are alone in what we are carrying. If we are not careful, we can become less open, less curious, and less able to recognize the complexity and dignity of others — and perhaps even of ourselves.

In other words, the pressures of this moment can estrange us from some of the qualities and capacities that make us most fully human: wonder and humility, creativity and joy, compassion and responsibility, imagination and hope, courage and wisdom. They can leave us feeling powerless to grow, to change, or to make a meaningful difference.

That is why the High Holy Days feel so necessary this year.

These sacred Days of Awe offer us space to breathe and reflect; to reconnect with ourselves, with one another, and with something greater than ourselves. They invite us to pause long enough to consider where we have been, who we have become, and who we might yet be. They remind us that growth, change, and renewal remain possible. And they call us to seek reassurance without complacency, belonging without conformity, and hope without denying reality.

Out of all this emerges the question that will guide our High Holy Day services this year:

What does it mean to you to be human? What, if

Vince Lombardi was wrong: Winning is not the only thing.



A Hasidic master remarked, "God did not say 'it was good' after creating humanity; this indicates that while the cattle and everything else were finished after being created, humanity was not finished."

As we enter the season of repentance and change, we are mindful that each of our lives is a work in progress. The Days of Awe are always a true gift for each of us, but only if we use these days wisely. That means waking up each morning and reflecting just a little bit on how we might improve our lives, and the lives of those we love, over the coming year.

Collectively, a community is a work in progress as well. We always need to be moving forward, seeking new ways to achieve our common goals. Sometimes that work can be very frustrating, and progress might seem far off. Rabbi Yisrael Salanter, who founded the 19th century Mussar movement for ethics, said that in engaging in community work, one must make three resolutions: *never lose one's temper; never get tired; and never want to win.*

Those guidelines are helpful to us as we return from summer wanderings and re-engage, building with new energy. But admittedly, the guidelines sound tone-deaf in a key election year, both here and in Israel.

Salanter's first two suggestions make perfect sense, but I am especially intrigued by the third of those resolutions.

Never want to win? Really?

One would think that the goal of any collective endeavor would be to "win." Ideally, we might hope that it be a "win-win" so that one side's victory might not be another's defeat. But Salanter knew nothing of "win-wins." For him, the problem isn't that there are winners or losers, but that there are sides in the first place. To have an "us" does not imply that there necessarily has to be a "them." If we think of the "us" as an inner circle, perhaps our family, our work group or our congregation, those who do not fall within that circle don't necessarily have to be in another circle entirely; they can simply be part of a larger circle that includes us as well.

The sooner we stop dividing the world into we's and they's, into in's and out's, the sooner we'll realize that these divisions are illusory and that, ultimately, we all are one. Let's hold that thought as we approach the New Year, all of us, the young, the old and the in between, the broken and the not yet broken, all of us, together, as one.

Mara, Ethan, Daniel and I join as one in wishing you a Shanah Tova U'Metukah. And don't forget to check out my

WE WELCOME YOU TO JOIN US ON SHABBAT MORNINGS

We warmly welcome you to show up for services on Shabbat in whatever way is meaningful to you. A reminder: you don't have to attend services to come for lunch on Shabbat! Services begin at 10 am, and we get to lunch around 12:15 pm. You can also show up for and/or leave services any time:

- From 10 until about 10:30 am, we sing the joyous and soulful melodies of P'sukei D'zimrah, the preliminary service.

- From about 10:30 to 10:45 am is the morning service, Shacharit (including greatest hits like Shema and the Amidah).

- We take the Torah out at about 10:45 am, and chant from the Torah and Haftarah portions until about 11:30 am.

- The D'var Torah (sermon) takes place around 11:30 am.

Between 11:45 am-12:15 pm, we conclude the service with Musaf, Aleinu, and Adon Olam (we always invite children up to help lead some of these final prayers, and any kid who helps lead gets to pick a prize from the Rabbi's "Tchotchke Chest").

And for those who wish to partake, you are welcome to make a "L'Chaim!" with us on a beverage of your choosing (whether alcoholic or non-alcoholic) after services.

anything, is unique and irreplaceable about our humanity — and how might we recover and cultivate it in a world that so often diminishes it?

Of course, the High Holy Days will be only the beginning of this exploration. In our learning and conversations together in the coming year, we will keep returning to the qualities and capacities that make us human, considering what threatens or diminishes them and how we might more intentionally cultivate them — within ourselves, in our relationships, and in our shared life.

I do not expect us to arrive at one simple or definitive answer. My hope is that asking the question together over time will help us notice what the pressures of this moment are doing to us, identify the qualities and capacities we are unwilling to relinquish, and become more intentional about the people we want to be and the world we want to help create.

With that in mind, as we prepare to enter the new year, I invite you to reflect on this prompt:

What helps you feel most fully human? Which parts of your humanity feel most difficult to hold onto right now, and why? What quality or capacity within yourself would you most like to recover or cultivate in the year ahead? How might you go about doing so?

I would love to hear your thoughts. Please email your reflections to me at rabbiknopf@tbe.org. You do not need to answer every question, and your response does not need to be polished. A few honest sentences about whichever question speaks to you would be wonderful; a longer reflection is welcome, too.

What you share will help inform our High Holy Day services and our learning together throughout the year. If you would be comfortable having some or all your words shared with the congregation — either with your name or anonymously — please let me know. Otherwise, I will regard your reflection as something shared privately with me.

I hope many of you will respond. Our preparation for the High Holy Days can and should begin even before we enter the sanctuary: by listening to one another, noticing what has become depleted or disconnected within us, imagining what renewal might look like, and considering how we might begin moving toward it.

I look forward to breathing, reflecting, learning, praying, and beginning again with you — and to continuing this exploration together throughout the year ahead.
